

**UNFSS: Grassroots Perspectives**  
An Independent Food Systems Summit Dialogue, India  
29 January 2021, 11:00 – 13:00 IST  
*Convened by Bharat Krishak Samaj and Rythu Sadhikara Samstha (RySS)*

A broad understanding is emerging that our food systems are profoundly inequitable; they play a major role in environmental degradation. The pandemic and its devastating impacts have brought these vulnerabilities into sharper focus. Yet, food systems also have immense potential to improve the health of our bodies, our economies and our environment. For this, it is vital to transform the way the world produces, consumes and thinks about food.

In pursuit of this goal, the [United Nations Food Systems Summit 2021](#) is being convened as part of the Decade of Action to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030. Guided by five [Action Tracks](#), the Summit will bring together key players from the worlds of science, business, policy, healthcare and academia, as well as farmers, indigenous people, youth organizations, consumer groups, environmental activists, and other key stakeholders.



These dialogues offer a purposeful and organized forum for stakeholders to come together to share their roles in food systems, consider their impacts on others and find new ways to support the SDGs. The outcomes of the Summit Dialogues will feed into the Summit process and help to guide individual and collective action towards a future of food that is sustainable, equitable and secure.

We believe the FSS Dialogues are a unique opportunity to bring voices and perspectives of diverse and often underrepresented food systems actors into the Summit process. These actors, such as farmers, are crucial stakeholders in any proposed transformation of our food systems. As organizations that advocate for and work towards the interests of farmers and producers, we felt the need to organize an Independent Dialogue that would represent the farmers' stakes in our food systems.

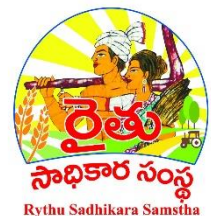
